CHRSTMAS SCAM ALERT

Don't fall for fake deals

Scammers love the holiday shopping season. It's the perfect time for them to lure people in with fake deals and trick their victims into paying for items that are counterfeit or don't exist. Here are some tips to help you protect yourself.

Do:

- Open websites by typing them into your browser, not by clicking links
- Consider whether deals you see on social media are too good to be true
- Research sites and sellers reading reviews can help you understand if they're genuine.

Don't:

- · Open links in emails or text messages you weren't expecting
- Buy high value items from sellers on social media that you can't view in person first
- Agree to use gift cards as a payment method criminals might ask you to do this because it's harder to trace.

Remember: if a deal looks too good to be true, it usually is.

From Totnes Times 'Peep at the Past' 9 November 2023

50 years ago

Miss Cynthia *Clapp followed in her mother's footsteps as Clerk of Diptford Parish Council 25 years ago – but the prospect of re-training after local government reorganisation and pressure from other commitments has now forced her to retire.

Miss Clapp joined the Parish Council when her mother, who had also been clerk, retired.

"I feel it is time for someone else to have a go at the job," said Miss Clapp, who runs the village Post Office and is a Totnes Times correspondent.

"Under local government reorganisation, clerks are required to re-train, but I feel I do not have the time to spend on going away on a course."

Miss Clapp is one of the village's best-known residents. She is the parish Church organist and secretary of the Parochial Church Council, a job which she hopes to continue.

"I have always been very interested in local government and I will miss the Council," said Miss Clapp who was born in Diptford.

In the Parish magazine, the Vicar of Diptford, the Rev Peter Willis, says "For 25 years Miss Clapp has loyally served as clerk and, as in everything she does, nothing has been too much trouble."

• Note – the Totnes Times of November 1973 made an error with Miss Clapp's name. She was in fact Miss **Cecily** Clapp.

When Val Haddy, and coincidentally ourselves, moved to the village in 1977, Miss Clapp was still a very important part of the Diptford community. As well as running the Post Office, pictured below, she produced pantomines in the old parish hall which many residents of the village will remember. Miss Clapp was awarded the BEM (British Empire Medal). In St Mary's Church, Diptford is a cabinet with memories of Miss Clapp – well worth a visit. Indeed a pillar of our community. SF
