

January 2024 Gardening

A total of 12 'living fossils' have been planted at RHS gardens Wisley and Rosemoor, as part of a global conservation effort to protect the critically endangered Wollemi pine tree (Wollemia nobilis). Once thought extinct until a chance discovery in 1994 in a remote gorge in the Wollemi National Park in Australia. The wild trees are increasingly vulnerable to disease and narrowly escaped being destroyed by wild fires during 2019 and 2020.

[If this plant could be 'bulked up commercially', it might be suitable as another Christmas Tree species, especially in our 'softer climate'!]

At this time of the year the weather is likely, to prevent many of us from doing very much in the garden. Take time out to sit and ponder in the 'potting shed'. Dream a little, evaluate a lot and plan for the future. Choosing particular plants for the garden long term, especially for the wild life and the benefit to the soil. There will be occasional clear bright drier days when you will be able to get outside and get things done. Have a go but not too energetically or you will certainly feel the strain later. It would be a good time to tackle the borders that can be safely reached when the shrubbery is not so prolific and the path is more easily reached.

How about a bit of work to remind you?

- Shred all prunings & clean old herbaceous material.
- Continue clearing up when conditions allow. Avoid walking on wet soil as this could cause soil compaction.
- ✤ Have you planned next year's ornamental displays & vegetable plot?
- ✤ Time to order or purchase seeds.
- ✤ A job to do in the shed, sterilise & wash all the containers, pots & trays.
- Have you really given those tools you used at the end of autumn a thorough clean & wipe-down with an oily rag?
- Sow half-hardy annuals under protection.
- Dead-head winter flowering plants.
- Prune blackcurrants & other fruit bushes.
- ✤ Heel in bare-rooted trees & shrubs when they arrive.
- Plant out new fruit trees & bushes as conditions permit.
- ✤ Carry out formative pruning on new trees & shrubs.
- Check store fruit, even the jams and conserves!
- ✤ Winter prune fruit trees & bushes.
- Keep up with the protection of plants in the greenhouse.
- Make certain the heaters are working properly. Double layer the 'bubble-wrap' or cover with newspaper or hessian sacks. Keep a small area well wrapped rather than trying to heat the whole of the greenhouse.
- ★ Keep the debris off the lawn, especially leaves, twigs and wormcasts.
- Service mowers & other equipment before the spring rush!
- If you have any organic material left spread it around on the borders & beds.
- ♦ Check stakes & ties to prevent strangulation & over growth constriction.
- Plant broad beans, sow early vegetables under glass for protection.
- Prune wisteria, just like a grape vine!

Rest when you feel a bit tired, there is always tomorrow. Take a cup of tea with a dash!

Nature Notes for December 2023 [JANUARY 2024 EDITION]

It has been a rather wet and windy December that has removed leaves and twigs from the trees. There has been much flooding around Devon, and often leaving no direct train link from Salisbury to Exeter. Locally trees have come down blocking roads, various hedge banks have collapsed and added to the wintry chaos.

There was a very cold snap early in the month, but it only lasted for about a day, before the rains returned. BBC weather has said on several occasions that particular areas of Devon have received more than the expected amount of rain for the time of year, but just in a day or so. The ground seems to be saturated, with the river running very high for several days at a time. Surface runoff must be high and groundwater must be topping up.

Wintry forms and shapes of trees adding to the scene of winter atmosphere. Heavy, water laden clouds and dull skies all contributing to a dismal feeling. Occasional bright sunshine lifts the spirits.

Found a Peacock butterfly [Inachis io] in the log store. Must have been sheltering from the rain at the time. Moved it further back into the dry. Not sure whether they hibernate or not! The potting shed no longer has any overwintering Herald Moths. Seems as if the 'South Hams Spiders' have eventually finished them off. These spiders are becoming a real nuisance as they have taken to coming indoors into the warm and drier conditions of the house interior. Probably come in on the logs and found a quiet corner to spin their festoons of webbing. Did encounter one of the black, bead spiders with a potential nasty suck! This was in the house downstairs by the toilet. It crawled into the piece of toilet paper offered and then fortunately went for a swim! [Steatodes paykulliana is said to be a European relative of the American Black Widow]. This species has been increasing in numbers as climate change takes hold. A resident of drier rocky conditions of southern Europe. In our climatic conditions most would normally be eliminated by cold, wet weather of a more typical Western European winter! But now they appear to be surviving in numbers. Slow moving and menacing shiny dark 'beads'. They are an ambush spider, not needing to run or hide, knowing their venom will protect them from most dangers. Have seen the results of bites on humans looking quite unpleasant and long lasting and painful. [The bites, not the humans!].

Still many woodlice around the bottoms of containers. Bit late for the hedgehog to come for a takeaway. However, did see a hedgehog in the garden one cold night about 10 p.m. prospecting for food. Was most unusual find. It was a good size considering the time and season. Was also very active. Hope it survived its late visit. Many worms around the pots so the 'hog may have been looking for a chance feed on an unsuspecting worm.

Birds have been very grateful for full feeders and extra food thrown out for them. Any larger morsels are quickly taken up by the Rooks and Jackdaws.

The scent of the Mahonia Charity from the yellow flowers has been drifting round the garden as a delightful sweet surprise. So strong has this fragrance been that even during the cold snaps bumble bees have frequented the flowers to collect the free presents of nectar and pollen. [Winter Jasmin] 'Jasmin nudiflorum' has been a bright attraction for insects in the front garden, and despite the cold weather stacks of gnats have collected above the flowers awaiting their turn to sample the delights. Many Ladybirds collecting in the folds of the bark on the apple trees, will they survive a hard winter in such exposed locations? Have seen many very small grey ghost moths outside, with some venturing into the house for protection from the colder weather. They seem to collect above the skirting board, perhaps it is considerably warmer here, especially near the radiators!
