#### February Edition 2024 [January Nature Notes 2024]

Heard the Tawny Owls [*Strix aluco*] early in the night 'Tu-whit' and 'Tu-whoo'. Then much later at almost morning heard Foxes yelping from the Avon Rise field direction. Like an episode of a murder mystery from Sherlock Holmes, very atmospheric! The bejewelled plumage of the Starlings [*Sturnus* 

vulgaris] are back in large flocks of up to twenty birds. Strutting and squabbling on gawky gait, these 'wind-up' mechanical birds take over the garden until one suddenly flies off and all the others move within an eye-blink. The winter plumage is a glory to see especially the adult males with their more intense dark under feathers, showing off the star spots of their 'jewel' plumage.



Blackbirds [Turdus merula] both male and female are back in the garden especially after the cold



snap. Even the Robins [*Erithacus rubecula*] have put in an appearance, however timid. More wrens [*Troglodytes troglodytes*] have appeared flitting amongst the 'undergrowth'. Their loud shrill voices stopping the other birds calling whilst they turn towards these 'heavyweights' of the sound world. Decibels, far louder than their size suggests, attracts attention.

A pretty female Bullfinch [*Pyrrhula pyrrhula*] spent a pleasant half an hour in the front garden picking out seeds from the Dandelions. The approximate size of a Sparrow, but with a black cap and dull chest, not the bright pink of the male. The sturdy beak soon made short work of the seeds. Having finished off the Dandelions it took flight to find its next meal.

Several groups of Blue Tits [Parus caeruleus] carefully worked their way along apple twigs removing aphids from the curled leaves. Better than a spray!

Woody, the Wood Pigeon, has come back with a mate to share the picking from the feeders. They waddle across the grass to wait for the shower of seeds caste out by the sparrows and other small feeders. Clearing up the fallen bounty until they can barely fly off to drink from the bird bath. When they land on the bath it wobbles on its plinth, as they are so heavy.

Found numerous what looked like 'Conocybe tenera' fungi on the front lawn. Small and short yellowish-brown conical caps with cinnamon brown crowded gills and spores. Usually gone after a frost or heavy shower of rain. The Rooks and other birds have removed great clumps of moss from between the roof tiles. These clumps were quite dry considering the amount of rain there has been in the first two weeks of the year. Ground generally saturated and pooling. The ground water must have been topped up by now! Reservoirs must be full by now!

Mentioned the scented plants already in flower, now here is a first. A Primrose is in bloom in the garden, and the Daffodils by Dorsley Farm on the way to Totnes are about to burst. Amazing enough mthat Morrisons at Totnes have Hot Cross buns for sale before the Christmas period has ended, but for Nature to have significant flowers out of season!

Have heard the frog or Toad, 'singing' by the pond trying to attract a mate or encourage others to kep clear of its territory! Perhaps there will be significant spawn this year. The last few year there has been little or none in the pond! Not much other activity in the pond, even the fish have gone to the depths to keep away from the surface cold. Occasionally there have been stacks of gnats when the sun has finally come out. Orb spiders have spun nets up until the frost and the one-day-snow! Nature Notes January 2024.

#### **February 2024 Garden Notes**

It may just have escaped your notice that BBC Television Weather News has now reached its 70<sup>th</sup> Year [January 2024]. To add to the records, last year [2023] was the warmest yet, amongst a whole series of warming years in the last ten. Global warming has really made an impression, whilst government leaders have been talking about the impending effects of sea-level temperatures rising, [including the



effects of 'el nino' and 'la nina'], ice melting at the poles, overall average world temperatures rising, and so the depressing list of weather facts goes on. There are still many who 'believe' the scientists might have 'got it wrong'! If you take the long view, across millions of years, then perhaps these figures fit into the pattern of the earth's changes over those millions of years. After all the earth has been round for a few millions of years, across several epochs and numerous geological eras and periods. The insects will cope with change!

How about a bit of work for the month of February 2024?

- The best place to be at this time of the year is in the greenhouse!
- No need to be in too much of a hurry even in this protected environment, the sun is still low in the sky and the light waves will only encourage seedlings to be 'drawn' or extenuated.
- Continue shredding all clean prunings & old herbaceous material for the compost heap.
- Heard a lady talking on Tony Buckland's gardening programme about the benefits of mulching
  using her own compost. She emphasised the weed suppressant effect, moisture retention, &
  mineral replacement. A most interesting interview took place
  as she had come from South Africa many years ago & she felt she was more knowledgeable
  now about 'British' gardens & gardening than she was about gardening in South Africa. The
  variations in style and location in South Africa was considerable, it must be understood.
- When conditions allow continue tidying up [but not too tidy, remember your friends need somewhere to live & work!] & preparing beds & borders.
- You have sat down in the warmth & planned this year's garden? An extra drink will be needed to get the little grey cells to activate & give inspiration to your efforts!
- Order seeds & plants if not already completed.
- Have you completed sowing those half-hardy annuals?
- Avoid walking on wet or sticky soil, you know how easily the soil compacts & stops drainage.
- Time to prune currant bushes & place a good pile of compost around the plants. {A bit of compound organic fertiliser under the compost would help replace the minerals used last year & encourage the plants to grow strongly to produce more flowers & fruit this year.
- Plant new replacement tree & bushes when the conditions permit.
- In the greenhouse sow; tomatoes, peppers & other tender plants together with some early vegetables to give them a head start.
- You could try sowing some tender annuals too.
- Be aware that it could still be quite frosty & you need to take appropriate precautions. Bubble wrap [left over from Christmas] is ideal to quickly cover plants and seed trays.
- Do not water from the top onto trays & pots. Put containers in a water tray to soak through the soil. Remove after a couple of hours.
- Ventilate except in cold weather. The Victorian gardeners used to tap clay pots to see if they
  'wrang' checking the need to water or not! Not so easy with plastic pots! But remember plastic
  pots retain moisture and the soil is therefore colder than with clay pots.
- Have you kept the grass clear of twigs & leaves? You could aerate the lawn & remove some of the thatch now. A warming job for a dry chilly day. Enjoy the season. Zephyrus

#### **MOBILE LIBRARY SERVICE ANNOUNCEMENT – CESSATION OF SERVICE**

The Devon mobile library service will be ending on Thursday 29th February 2024.

Devon County Council made the decision to end the service in autumn 2023 and we are now preparing for the end of the service.

We are working with Devon County Council to best support customers through this transition.

Each regular mobile library customer will be emailed and telephoned by library staff during January and talked through alternative arrangements to help them continue to access books. These alternatives include our <a href="Home Library Service">Home Library Service</a>, the <a href="Good Neighbours scheme">Good Neighbours scheme</a>, using our <a href="static libraries">static libraries</a> and our <a href="BorrowBox">BorrowBox</a> app for digital downloads.

Our mobile library assistants will be updating customers on the regular mobile library stops and will redirect customers to the alternative arrangements.

The County Council has launched a grant fund to support local community library spaces and you can find out more by following this link: Community Library Support Fund - Communities (devon.gov.uk)

Books can be returned to the mobile libraries up until that date. Afterwards they can be taken back to your nearest Devon library building – you can find addresses and details <a href="https://example.com/here">here</a> or you can call 0345 155 1001 for more information. We'd like to reassure you that there will not be any fines for returning items late.

To continue to borrow books and use library services from 1<sup>st</sup> March 2024 we need your consent to change your record in the Libraries Unlimited system, to enable you to borrow from a library building and/or online.

Please get in touch with us before 1st April so that we can update your record.

We very much hope you will be able to use another one of our services to access your books. These include:

**The Home Library Service** where dedicated volunteers can choose and deliver books to your home, including large print and audiobooks. This service is free.

And the **Good Neighbours Scheme** which is a membership for friends, neighbours and family wishing to choose and deliver books to those not able to get to the library. You can call them on 0345 155 1001.
