North Huish Community Group

This group was set up in 2023 with the purpose of organising community events for the residents of North Huish and surrounding villages. The venue is St Mary's Church, North Huish, now closed for regular public worship but kept open to the public, providing a meeting space for the local community. This beautiful Grade 1 listed building is in the care of the Churches Conservation Trust, a national charity protecting historic churches at risk. Funds donated at events held there, help to support the cost of repair and maintenance which, in a typical year, can amount to nearly £2,000. Currently, there is a power supply but no electric circuit installed so, this year, a proportion of the funds raised are to be set aside to pay for the installation of electric sockets where they are most needed for safety and convenience when running events.

MARCH 2024

It has been reported that Climate Stress has caused fruit trees to suffer from diseases. Drought, high temperatures and heavy rainfall have led to an increase in fruit tree diseases. These problems of extreme weather conditions have made plants more susceptible to disease. This is based on enquiries to the RHS Gardening Advice Service. To minimise plant disease advice includes practicing good plant hygiene, mulching plants while the soil is moist and pruning out dead or diseased material. After winters with such prolonged and heavy rain it, is a good procedure to replace leached out minerals with an organic compound fertiliser in spring when the soil is warming up in March/April. Something like Fish/Blood/Bone is very useful, then after having forked this in cover with a thick mulch to retain warmth and moisture.

March can be a very busy month but don't be too eager to get onto the soil as if wet it compacts easily, especially if the soil is heavy. Let the soil dry out before working or sowing seeds. These seeds will not germinate in heavy, damp soil. You will be wasting time and money!

What can be done when the weather allows?

- ✓ Hoe and weed all borders and beds to get rid of annual weeds.
- ✓ Prepare seed beds
- ✓ Finish spreading organic mulch
- ✓ If the soil is dry enough, sow hardy annuals outside.
- ✓ Pot on cuttings under protection [Pelargoniums, Fuchsias, etc].
- ✓ Plant out sweet peas
- ✓ Lift & divide Snowdrops as they finish flowering (in the green).
- ✓ Plant summer flowering bulbs
- ✓ Finish pruning fruit trees, except plums, also prune currants gooseberries & cane fruit.
- ✓ Prune roses to accepted height.
- ✓ Feed trees & bushes with compound fertiliser.
- ✓ Remove thatch & open up the grass with a spring-tined rake.
- ✓ Feed grass with an appropriate spring grass feed.
- ✓ Re-sow or re-turf patches of worn grass if weather is right.
- ✓ If weather is warm a& dry start mowing with high set blades.
- ✓ Finish cutting back & tidying beds & borders.
- ✓ Divide & re-plant existing perennials.
- ✓ Prepare borders for new planting.
- ✓ Label up any extra divisions ready to 'give away'.
- ✓ Check staking & ties after the winter winds.
- ✓ Prune out any damaged or diseased material.
- ✓ Tie in climbers.
- ✓ Prune shrubs that will flower on new growth.
- ✓ Give the greenhouse some attenti0on.
- ✓ Start watering regime especially if the weather is hot.
- ✓ Continue sowing tomatoes, peppers, chilies etc.
- ✓ Ventilate during the day, & watch out for the odd night frost or temperature drop.
- ✓ In the vegetable area, earth up those potato shoots.
- ✓ Give spring cabbage a generous nitrogenous feed.
- ✓ Sow or plants onions, shallots, mid & late crop potatoes, leeks

Enjoy the season.

February Nature Notes March Edition 2024

It has been an exceptionally wet month. Some areas of the South West have had one and a half times the average expected rainfall in the first week of February. BBC weather news quoted that 147 mm were received in a week, whilst only 100mm were expected for the whole month. The soil is so saturated that excess rain has poured off the topsoil, taking fine material with it.

The owls have been conducting orchestral pieces overnight to mark out their territories. The woodpeckers have been drumming during the day searching for grubs in the old branches or echoing their patch down in the valley. The spring bird garden watch saw the usual collection of numbers and species. Wren, Robins, Blackbirds, Starlings, Rooks, Blue Tits, Sparrows, and Wood Pigeons all visited at the appropriate time to be recorded. Outside that time had Longtailed Tits, Goldfinches, Sparrow Hawk, a lone Greenfinch was reported, Wagtails, Great Tits, Thrush, Collared Doves, all appeared by magic out side the recording period to avoid being included on the returns sheet!

Snails and slugs are being removed both day and night by the hard work of Hedgehogs, Thrushes, Sparrows as well as the unseen workers: Beetles, Sloe Worms, and other helpers. Noticed many Ladybirds in clusters on leaf litter and twigs. They are out searching for Aphids and other tasty morsels. It looks as if the garden is being well protected by the friends. There are masses of small new worms around the base of pots and containers as well



as the colonies of woodlice. The Hedgehog has a huge take-away supply of food.

Heard the raucous notes of frogs and toads at night, calling for mates or pronouncing their territories. Toads with their dark, warty, dry and rough skin can been encountered crawling across damp grass and amongst the plants, whereas the slim, smooth, bright, damp frog is best seen hopping around near the pond. Both will go for their sauna to mate. This might be a good year for spawn!



Many plants flowering outside the accustomed period largely due to the mild winter. Snowdrops came early, Camelias have been an early surprise, many catching the frost and going over quickly, the beautiful Japanese 'quince' with its apricot tint opened slowly to reveal the mass 'Laura Ashly' fabric. Primroses and Daffodils have brightened the hedgerows with bright yellow.

Hellebores have come out with their hidden beauty. You need to raise their heads in order to see the markings inside the petals. The drift of Witch-Hazel scent around the garden has been most heady and wonderful. So many plants have taken advantage of the mild conditions to 'spring' ahead of their usual flowering time. Tree buds are swollen, ready to burst out. In some places Hawthorn is at the point of breaking into flower. By the river the Hazel bushes and trees are covered in the longest catkins seen for a long time. The lime-green-yellow strings give the plants a halo of colour. Khaki is probably the best colour description.

It has been Spring-like before the end of winter. A riot of colour and scent to make up for the wet unusual conditions.

What a wonder! Ham.

A very well attended February meeting of the WI which was attended by DFWI Chair Evelyn Watson. The purpose of Evelyn's visit was so that the Devon Federation could be satisfied that all our members were aware that we intend to leave the umbrella of the WI this year. All members had been asked for their agreement and, in addition, a vote to leave was undertaken at our 2023 AGM. There has been much discussion within and outside of the group about plans going forward. The committee is satisfied that all our members are aware of and in agreement with the decision to leave.

Prior to that, we had a most interesting presentation by our very own Debbie Dugdall, CEO and trustee of the charity **Breakthrough Transformation Trust**. The charity works with children, young people and families who have serious life challenges. It was a most interesting talk, and we learned that one of the charity's centres is nearby at Wrangaton. A small collection was made on the night, which is to be used for the purchase of seeds and gardening equipment for the students learning horticulture at our nearest centre. Some of us are hoping to arrange an evening of Bingo at Halwell & Moreleigh Village Hall on Friday 21 June in aid of this charity.

Following refreshments, we had the business part of the meeting, when arrangements were firmed up for coffee in Ivybridge and a lunch at Rattery with a talk by three auctioneers.

Garden Refuse - With spring approaching, subscriptions to the South Hams Garden waste collection service are now open. Early bird subscription will cost £52 for the year if you sign up before 1 April 2024. The price from 1 April will be £55. A subscription covers a single brown wheelie bin, with a maximum of two subscriptions (which would cover two bins) per household. The new subscription year will run from Monday1 April 2024 until 31 March 2025. You can sign up for the service on our website. The annual cost applies for fortnightly collections, excluding the weeks over the winter period when the service is suspended. Happy gardening!

Amenity Trust – We have now received a detailed inspection report and repairs are being actioned. Grants are currently being applied for, to help with the cost of repairs and replacement equipment.
