

Diptford Quiz 2025

The annual quiz was held in December. The event was as competitive as ever and enormous fun.

The result was remarkably close with fantastic efforts from every team involved.

Congratulations to **The Memory of an Elephant**, the team who triumphed narrowly.

(This team were operating, suspiciously, under an alias, they were previous winners as **The Book Club**, do not think we did not notice! We can spot you whatever name you go under).

The full result:

1. The Memory of an Elephant [99 Points]
2. Young Ones [95 ½ Points]
3. Fifty Percent [91 ½ Points]
4. Elves [88 Points]
5. Away With the Fairies [84 Points]

Well done everyone.

As ever, some rounds were found more difficult by the teams. Noticeably the round on puddings attracted over 80% correct answers, in contrast to English Literature at less than 40%, obviously reflecting the priorities in Diptford.

There were no cake questions this year, which usually attracts 100% correct answers, being another category, we are all rather fond of.

The two true or false rounds mysteriously only achieved a 51% correct answer success rate. I hate to mention it, but just guessing the answer should achieve around 50%.

No team achieved a perfect ten, in any round. Many came close to achieving perfection, with scores of fifteen “9s” recorded—just one mark away from the highest possible score.

The raffle raised all the money needed to supply the fare for around the Christmas Tree, which is the overall purpose of the quiz.

Thank you to everyone who attended and made a great evening of it.

NOTES FROM DIPTFORD PARISH COUNCIL MEETING DECEMBER 2025

**The next Diptford Parish Council Meeting will take place on
Tuesday 20 January.**

Notices and Minutes will be published on the Parish Council noticeboard near School, and on the Parish Council website.

All Parishioners are welcome to attend and can raise any item for a limited time within Open Forum at the start of the meeting.

Parishioners are recommended to contact clerk@diptfordparishcouncil.org beforehand.

Cllr Crocker was thanked by the Council for arranging the **Christmas Tree**, along with his son Toby, Ed Foster, Seb Lethbridge and Dan Paull. Everyone agreed that it looked spectacular.

Thermal Imaging Camera Hire – A meeting is planned in January in the Hall for interested people to attend so that we can arrange to hire the camera for a period. Watch social media and notice boards for more information. please let the Clerk know if you are interested. clerk@diptfordparishcouncil.org to help our community stay warm and save on energy bills this winter.

An application has been made to the Devon Community Fund for monies to be used towards the cost of **new equipment in the Playing Field**, and Cllr Carrol suggested that we should also be starting to fundraise to replace the Climbing Frame which is steadily deteriorating.

10 Fruit trees donated by the Wildlife Trust are expected to be delivered in early February and Council will be consulting the Tree Warden regarding siting and planting. Council will apply to the Devon Wildlife Trust for a **free 'Landmark' tree** and again will consult on a suitable site.

The Parish Council has agreed to construct an **Emergency Plan**, with particular emphasis on encouraging all vulnerable residents of the parish to register as such with their Power and Water companies to ensure they get priority treatment. Council asks any resident with suitable equipment or alternative power source to advise clerk@diptfordparishcouncil.org – this information to be kept confidential and will be redacted in any future published documents.

Concern was expressed about excessive amounts of mud deposited on local roads, making them dangerous for all, whilst appreciating that we live in a working farming environment..

DIPTFORD PARISH ELEEMOSYNARY CHARITY TRUST

Grants for teenagers in Diptford going on to higher or further education are available from a historic local charity that was originally created last century to benefit rural apprentices. The current Trustees now wish to broaden the eligibility and invite applications from a wider group of young people, who are resident in Diptford Parish and need financial assistance with equipment/books to support their university courses or further education including technical courses and apprenticeships.

Applications are also invited from any local parishioner who is undergoing or preparing for higher education or a further training scheme that provides a suitable life skill or employment qualification. Regular University course and accommodation costs do not qualify, but other supplementary one-off costs could be considered. Successful applicants will need to show evidence of the benefit and grant expenditure.

Applications to The Eleemosynary Charity Trust should cover the following headings:

- Full name: and name of parent for applications from children under 16.
- Address: (applications can only be accepted by residents of Diptford Parish).

- Reason for the application providing any evidence of need, the benefit, and details of what the grant will be expended on:
- A proposed breakdown of grant expenditure with associated cost evidence.

The merit of all applications will be assessed by trustees of the Eleemosynary Charity Trust on the individual's financial need and their personal benefit from a grant.

COLD CALLERS - OFFERING INSULATION REMOVAL SERVICES

We have been made aware that there may be cold callers offering insulation removal services in the Devon area.

If you want work doing in your home or garden please consider the following advice:

- Don't agree to work offered by unsolicited doorstep callers.
- Don't rely on posts or recommendations on social media sites without doing your own research.
- Don't be swayed by glossy flyers or impressive websites as they may not show the trader's own work.
- Don't pay cash or agree to be taken to the bank or immediately transfer money before any work is started.
- Don't be rushed into making a decision.

Do:

- Get three written quotes from reputable businesses.
- Research the companies you're looking to use e.g. ask for references and look online.
- Ask friends and family to recommend local traders or search via [Buy With Confidence](#)

• Decide who to use in your own time and make sure you have confidence in their skills and abilities.

• Make sure you have the full name of the company and the person doing the work and their contact details (address, phone number, email).

• Ask to see professional qualifications, public liability insurance and if applicable waste carriers licence.

• Check if you're entitled to your 14-day cooling-off period

If someone knocks on your door and you are not sure, don't open the door.

If you are concerned someone is at risk, always call the police.

If you are concerned rogue traders are operating in your area, always report it.

If a company claims to be working with a local council, contact the local council yourself to check this is true.


If you have concerns, or have any information please contact Trading Standards or police by phoning 101, if possible, please make a note of any descriptions and vehicle registrations seen.

Overhanging Hedges/Vegetation and Trees on Highways.

If you are a landowner with hedges / vegetation adjacent to the public highway, unless hedges are regularly cut back, they may cause an obstruction.

Landowners and occupiers are required, by law, to trim any hedge next to the public highway where the growth is preventing the passage, or affecting the safety, of the highway user. In accordance with the Highways Act 1980 which requires you to cut it back so it is no longer overhanging or obstructing the public highway.

Vegetation should be cut back to maintain the minimum required clearances for roads and footways:

- 5.5 m height clearance for vegetation overhanging roads.
- 2.1 m height clearance for vegetation overhanging footpaths.
- 2.5 m height clearance for vegetation overhanging cycleways.
