Parish Council

Diptford Playing Field

Our District Councillors Guy Pannell and Peter Smerdon have generously granted £250 each from their locality grant budgets towards providing outdoor exercise equipment for the Playing Field. Currently, we have applied for a Community Wellness Grant and are looking for other grants to help find the money needed for this exercise equipment which should benefit the health and wellness for those in the community

Highways

The Lengthsman has been busy carrying out work on the damaged drains at Glebeland which has been causing excess water on the road for some time now. The works carried out has resolved the issue of the flood water. A grateful thanks to the Lengthsman John Widdecombe and to Cllr Parker-Davidson for their work to finally resolve the issue of excess water especially at this time of year with the winter temperatures.

Precept Information/Financial Planning

The details of the Precept demand for 2023/2024 were noted. The Band D parish rate will be approximately £59.71 which will be an increase of approximately £7.78 (in comparison to 2022/2023 figures)

Graveyard

There is currently no further update on the closure to burials in the Graveyard at this time. South Hams District Council and Rob Seukula have inspected it. A further inspection is due to be carried out by SHDC groundsman to check the condition of walls, boundaries, etc. Currently there is no space for burials or cremations in the Graveyard.

Nature Notes January 2023 Edition [December Notes 2022]

An interesting month as a mild autumn, after an incredibly warm summer, suddenly switched fully into winter. The expected 'beast from the east' turned into 'the nightmare from the north'. A week of hard overnight frosts and then snow and continued as cold weather. Then back to milder conditions. The very hard frosts cleared away any soft growth, and ensured sufficient 'cold' units for future likely leaf buds to respond and some miraculously turn into flowers/fruit. A promise of fulfilment for later this year.



Birds have been active once they have warmed up, into

fluffy feather balls. The two Pied Wagtails [Motacilla alba yarrellii] have spent much time and energy intimidating small birds and squaring up to larger birds such as Blackbirds [Turdus merula] and even Starlings [Sturnus vulgaris]. These small Wagtails are continually 'protecting' their food source. Two little Wrens [Troglodytes troglodytes] actively flitting around searching for any caterpillars, spiders or insects, especially in the crevices of stonework or the greenhouse supports. Flocks of Rooks [Corvus frugilegus] take over the garden clearing away all the other birds, until they have finished foraging. Dark intelligence at work!

The last flowering perennial plants received the shock treatment of a week or more of overnight frosts and they have collapsed to the ground. Tight buds on the Contorted Hazel, Magnolia, Oak, Ash and Beech seem to have become even tighter than before. Holly, earlier full of berries, have been completely stripped. Even the crab apple fruit, hanging on from the summer, have been targeted as a viable food source by hungry birds, and probably mice!

Not much sign of mice in the potting shed, as yet! Food is there for them, if they choose to investigate and open the 'packets'! The South Hams spinning spiders [Pholcus phalangioides] seem to be missing from the shed. Has that application of garlic and mint really worked? Some Herald moths [Scoliopterix libatrix] have returned to overwinter in dry, cold comfort. Hibernation through to spring.

The coal nuggets were frozen in the coal bunker. Even in here spiders, woodlice, and beetles had sought refuge. On taking out some coal two Ghost moths were disturbed, and they flew away to find a quieter resting place!

Early one morning about 4.30 a.m. a fox [Vulpes vulpes crucigera] was walking up the road barking, to announce its presence. Calling so loudly the noise woke me up. It seemed to make more noise outside those properties that had chickens! On reaching the entrance to the Avon Dean field it sat to have a scratch, and then leisurely walked up the track to cross the field. It stopped calling once in the field! Was it marking where possible 'dinners' might be found, as a future take-away? Or simply warning others to keep away from its territory? Foxy will be back to investigate further, especially once cubs are needed to be fed!

The pond is now frozen. Some floating weed has been set in ice. No activity to be seen on the surface or in the dark depths! All the waterlily leaves have sunk without trace to the bottom. They will slowly rot adding to the detritus refuge for insect life to survive the winter. This spring these little creatures will surface to be active participants in the life of the pond. Must clear the leaves out of the pond!

In the bleak mid-winter, frosty wind made moan, Earth stood hard as iron, water like a stone; Snow had fallen, snow on snow, snow on snow, In the bleak midwinter, long ago.

JANUARY 2023 Garden Work

Well, here we are back at the start of a New Year, 2023. Have you listed all those accomplishments and the few failures. Promise yourself you will do better this year! Don't rush into the garden with all that physical effort. Sit back, relax, work out just what can be improved with a little thought, and a cup of something good to help stimulate the mind!

Are you 'thinking' what can be tackled in the garden?

- There must be some shredding left over to help fill the compost bin?
- o If or when conditions are favourable continue to fork over or dig the beds and borders.
- You can spend an age thoroughly cleaning and oiling those hand tools. At least you can keep in the warmth of the shed!
- There must be some more pots, trays and containers to clean and sterilize.
- You can spend and age pondering over catalogues and brochures trying to decide just what you could purchase. That's another job for the warmth of inside the house!
- Avoid walking on wet sticky soil. In other words stay indoors!
- o Dead head winter-flowering plants in the containers.
- Check plants for wind rock, or frost heave, and take appropriate action. Don't tie them in too tightly or you may strangle them!
- Plan this year's ornamental displays.
- A bit of clearing up when the weather permits would be useful. Remember you tiny friends as they need some shelter!
- o Have you ordered the seeds for this year?
- o A bit of pruning of Currants and other fruit bushes might be useful.
- When they arrive, heel in bare rooted trees and shrubs. You can prepare the soil for their final planting when conditions allow.
- Now is the time to winter prune fruit trees and bushes. You might want to trim down the roses if you have not managed that prickly task yet!
- o In the greenhouse make sure the heater is working, it might need turning up a bit. Helpful to protect plant with a bit of 'bubble wrap' left over from Christmas.
- Ventilate when the weather is sunny and a bit warmer. You don't want stale, damp air in the greenhouse too long. That might encourage mildew.
- The grass is probably not growing yet, but wind-blown leaves can be collected up in the mower box by a high cut.
- Get the mower serviced before the need to cut more regularly in spring!
- Are you maintaining those beds and borders for the perennials?
- Don't spread out that great compost your have made when the soil is very cold or frozen.
 The mulch will only keep the frost in the soil by insulating it from the 'warming' sun.
- Sow some early vegetables under glass.
- Check stored fruit and vegetables.
- Plant your broad beans.

Have a go at some root cuttings: Acanthus, Echinops, Phlox, and Oriental poppy are all good to try out. Choose strong roots of average thickness, but don't remove more than a quarter of the root system. Cut roots into 3-12 cm lengths depending on thickness. Trim off any minor rootlets or 'hairy' growth. To ensure they are inserted the right way up, make a horizontal cut across the upper and an angle cut at the lower end. Insert the cuttings vertically into a compost with some coarse sand added for drainage. Space 4cm apart with their tops just below the soil level. Cover with grit, and then water lightly. Label and place in greenhouse or against a sheltered wall. Await the green shoots of success in mid spring. Pot on into suitable containers. When large enough plant out into final positions! Congratulate yourself heartily, or commiserate!

The Eleemosynary Charity is a historic local charity created earlier last century to benefit 'poor parishioners and to provide grants to youngsters preparing to enter a trade or employment'.

There are two grant giving opportunities:

- 1. For low income households or those on benefits to help with health care or travelling costs involved in receiving medical care.
- 2. Grants towards an individual's education, training, or apprenticeship.

The Trustees now wish to broaden the eligibility of the opportunity for people to apply for these grants and invite applications from residents within Diptford Parish.

In relation to financial assistance with furthering their education, training, or apprenticeship grants of up to £800 may be made to individuals to assist with educational equipment, trade clothes and tools and specific travel costs and other associated fees towards their education. Applications are invited from any local parishioner under the age of 21 who is undergoing or preparing for education or a training scheme that provides a suitable life skill or employment qualification. Regular University or College course and accommodation costs do not qualify, but other supplementary one-off costs could be considered. Successful applicants will need to show evidence of the benefit and grant expenditure.

The Application Form for both types of grant simply covers the following headings:

- Full name: and name of parent for applications from children under 16.
- Address: (applications can only be accepted by residents of Diptford Parish).
- Email & Telephone:
- Reason for the application providing any evidence of need, the benefit, and details of what the grant will be expended on:
- A proposed breakdown of grant expenditure with associated cost evidence.

The merit of all applications will be assessed by trustees of the Eleemosynary Charity Trust on the individual's financial need and their personal benefit from a grant.
